Dear Parents / Carers

As the weather is finally getting warmer, a few reminders. **Summer uniform** is navy blue, black or grey shorts or trousers with a white or light blue polo shirt; pinafore dresses or skirts should be navy or black; cardigans or jumpers worn should be navy blue. Please ensure that the children are wearing clothes that cover their shoulders and this will protect them from the sun at lunchtime. As the sun gets stronger it is a good idea for them to have a hat to wear as well – please make sure that these are clearly marked with their name and class. We encourage children to bring in water to drink throughout the day – it must be water though, and not flavoured drinks please.

Since January we have been using a method of teaching literacy called **Talk for Writing** – you will remember that we had an INSET day to train all the staff. The results of using this strategy have been really good, and you will be able to see the improvements in the children's writing when you come in for Parents' Evening later on in the term. The children are really enjoying it, and are quickly developing a range of story-telling techniques that they can use both orally and in their writing. To celebrate this we are planning to end the term with a **whole school project** where all the children will be working around the same story. I think that the children will really enjoy it, and it will include an opportunity for you all to come in and see the children perform. We will keep you posted...



Thank you for helping to minimise the amount of **litter** being dropped in the playground, and in the streets immediately surrounding the school.
