Dear Parents / Carers

Thank you to all the parents who came along to support the children – I know that they liked having you there. Thanks to the staff who organised each of the events, and to Ms Miller and her team of sports leaders at Eastlea who organised the KS2 day.





The International Food Fair was a lovely way to mark the end of a very successful year for the school. Once again, you did us proud by cooking up a storm, and bringing in dishes to share. Thank you to all who contributed, and thank you to the parents who helped us to clear up afterwards – that was very much appreciated.

We had a fantastic day on Tuesday at the **Para athletics** in the Olympic Stadium and the children and staff all really enjoyed themselves. The atmosphere was great, the children really got behind the athletes and showed their support for them. Thank you to Mr Ahmed for organising the tickets way back at the start of the year – it was a really good event to have in the last week of term. We are lucky to have the stadium on our doorstep, and it is really nice to be able to ensure that the children are able to experience some of these very high profile events.





The **school choir** performed at the **Royal Festival Hall** on Tuesday evening, as part of the NEWYVC Unite Festival – Peace in Every Voice. It was an amazing performance, involving hundreds of children from across East London. As well as our choir, there were lots of our ex-pupils performing as part of their secondary schools which was lovely to see.
