Dear Parents / Carers

It has been a very busy half term – we have manged to pack in a huge amount to the last 6 weeks! The children are all well settled into their new classes, and really enjoying their learning. It is lovely to walk around the school and to see the excitement in the classes each day. The staff have all been busy planning for after half term, and November and December will be just as busy I am sure.

There have been lots of trips that have taken place this half term. This week Year 1 visited the **Science Museum**, and Year 3 visited the **Museum of London** and explored a Roman amphitheatre. Year 2's trip to **London Zoo** was postponed last week, and they will be going in the week



after half term. Earlier in the month Year 4 visited the **Sea Life Centre** and Year 5 went to **Kew Gardens**. Right at the start of term Year 6 visited the **Ragged School Museum**.





These visits all help to bring to life the learning in the classroom, and to help the children deepen their understanding of what it is that they are learning about. Plus they are really enjoyable and a lot of fun!



We have had a series of workshops in school this week run by the **Metropolitan Police**. This is part of their work with children to help them keep themselves safe. They worked with Reception and Year 1 on **Trusted Adults**; with Year 2 on **Personal Safety**; with Year 3 on **Road Safety**; with Year 4 on Internet Safety; The Police will be working with Year 6 on both **Internet Safety** and on **Gangs and Peer Pressure** after half term. Year 5 will be going

on a borough-wide trip to Tate & Lyle at the end of November to do a series of workshops run by the emergency services and other organisations that cover a wide range of safety issues. These sessions are really important, and really help us all to keep the children safe.






Some lovely news to share – Mrs Emily Smith had her baby last Friday, a baby girl who they have named Esme.
