It is good to see the children achieving well, and making excellent progress from their starting points as they arrived here at Manor. This was reflected in the progress measures last year (2014 data not yet available) which put us in the top 9% of schools across the country. Well done to all!



This year, our priorities are:

Attainment & Progress: For all children to make good progress and to achieve their potential.

Curriculum: To make sure that the new curriculum is engaging and purposeful and helps children to make good progress.

Ethos: For the school's values and ethos to be evident in all areas of school life.

Teaching & Learning: For all teaching to be at least good, with an increasing amount that is outstanding.

Speaking & Listening: To provide purposeful opportunities for improving the children's S&L across all areas of the curriculum.

All the work and training that we do as a school this year will be based around these priorities.

We have a brand **new Newsletter Team** who are just starting to learn how to publish the newsletter. Well done to last year's team who did a great job producing 5 excellent newsletters. I am sure that they will have some helpful hints to pass on! The first edition of the year is due out just before half term.





Once again we have **Festival Assemblies** planned to recognise a range of festivals across the main religions. Please see the website for details of which festivals and when. Our first one is for **Rosh Hashanah**, a Jewish festival, and is being led by Year 2. It is next <u>Wednesday 24th September, at 1:30pm</u> in the Top Hall.
