Dear Parents / Carers

All classes are very busy working on their contributions to the **Whole School Art Project**. You will have seen that the corridor between the two playgrounds has been prepared and is ready for the new artwork to be installed. Ms McGill has been busy working with many of the classes as they prepare for and work towards their final product. The theme that we have used this year is UNICEF's Rights of the Child. This concept underpins all that we do here, as is shown in us being a Rights Respecting School. The children have been involved in some very interesting discussions about what these rights are and how we ensure that they are upheld. Keep a close eye on the corridor – the work will be coming soon!

On Wednesday Year 6 led a very thoughtful Remembrance Day assembly for the whole school. They had put a lot of thought

into preparing it and presented it very well. They talked about the difference between remembering and remembrance. They had researched letters and poetry from the First World War, and talked about how it was a time to remember not just those that had died in World War 1 and 2, but in all the other conflicts that there have been around the world since. They ended by leading a two minute silence.

Well done to the staff and children in Year 6 for a very fitting way to mark Armistice Day.

As you can see the contractors have finally started to install the **new fencing** around the perimeter of the school. We are hoping that it will be completed by the end of the month. At that time we will then be able to start to use the two playgrounds at lunchtime, and not just the one. It has been interesting having all of the children in one playground, and has worked well with lots of the children making a point of playing with younger or older siblings and friends.



We will be talking to the children shortly about how we will organise lunchtimes going forward.



A group of Year 6 children went to Birkbeck University last week as part of the launch of their **Brilliant Club**project. They work with a PhD student on the subject of philosophy – 'What is fairness?' They are expected to use independent study skills and have university style tutorials, and have to learn essay writing skills. Their final assignment is marked and graded. After a successful completion the children go to a university for a graduation ceremony.

Well done to Kausar in Year 5 who is Manor's first graduate of the **Children's University**. He attended a special ceremony in central London and received his certificate! I look forward to seeing more of these photos.
